## Video Trainings

## Technology Coordinator Training

<p><b>Technology Coordinator Training</b></p> <p>This training provides an overview of TestNav 8, including its updates, system requirements, and configurations. It covers technology resources on the Minnesota Assessment Hub, the TestNav 8 Online Support page, and the installation and management of TestNav applications.</p> <p>The training also addresses system configurations such as firewalls, content filters, and assistive technologies. Additionally, it includes an App Check for network connections to Pearson servers, guidance on testing with tablets and Chromebooks, and support for older devices.</p> <p>The Early Warning System (EWS) section explains scenarios that trigger EWS and common resolutions. The training also covers the Infrastructure Readiness Check, including accessing the Training Center to set up test sessions, running an infrastructure trial, and verifying device compatibility for assistive technology.
